ANNUAL REPORT FY 2021-2022

<u>Mission Statement</u>: The Elkader Public Library provides the residents of the community and the surrounding area equal access to resources and services for information, continuing education, and recreation.



Despite the on-going pandemic, library usage continues to increase. Many mitigation measures have become part of our regular routine, such as disinfecting surfaces at least twice daily, and providing more options for families to participate in library activities from their homes. For the Summer Reading Program in June and July, families had the choice to attend in-person or complete the program on their own at home. The in-person Story Time groups were kept small by offering one on Monday and one on Thursday. The sessions were kept brief by preparing crafts kits for families to complete at home. The in-person Junior Readers met only once a week on Wednesdays, and they completed most activities on site. The Friends of the Library sponsored two special presentations for children and families which were held off-site.

Book discussions for adults continued in person throughout the year. A presentation on the Holocaust was held in September and "take-and-make" bags were made available to families in October for Fire Safety Week and for Halloween. In December, the Friends of the Library provided Family Fun Bags with crafts and activities for families to do on their own at home during winter break. The Friends of the Library also sponsored a magician on St. Patrick's Day and a program on Grant Wood in April.

The remaining 4% came from the revenue from overdue fines, fees for services, the State Library Enrich Iowa program, and library service contracts with the towns of Elkport, Garber, and St. Olaf.
